Chairman's Statement

I am delighted to present the Annual Review and Impact Report for 2016-17.

This year has been one of numerous financial challenges, as we seek to grow our capacity and respond to the ever-increasing need for specialist therapy provision. The Board has prioritised Better Start, Better Future, the new Early Intervention programme for babies, a decision which is supported by research evidence. In addition, we strove to maintain a comprehensive service for older children, but this has been impacted by the numbers of younger children we

are seeing. Our waiting list continues to grow, placing constant demand on our fundraising team to secure finance for recruiting additional therapists so that we can provide therapy for more children across Wales.

I am pleased to report that over the year, we were able to offer 449 therapy treatment interventions. These ranged from single consults to longer intensive blocks, with babies returning for therapy every four months. This is an increase of 117 episodes of care over the previous year, when we provided 332 interventions, and reflects the impact of new therapists joining the therapy team (see Centre Director's report for more details) as well as the development of new service models.

Financially, we have faced some difficulties. Results this year show income of £1,232,075 and expenditure of £1,283,124 resulting in a cash short fall of £51,049 and overall deficit of £92,113 after depreciation charges of £41,064. Whilst we continue to contract with Local Health Boards for referrals for a number of children, the vast majority of the income needed to run the Centre must be raised through fundraising initiatives. The economic environment is constantly changing and the team works hard to adapt and concentrate its efforts and focus in response to this changing landscape.

This year's results include successes in raising funds from trusts & foundations, social events and a family appeal, as well as increased income from running therapy training courses. Costs continue to increase as we expand our therapy capacity, and the inevitable associated support costs. Our Centre building, which is pre- World War One, is tired and requires frequent



unplanned maintenance, which is an increasing concern and expense.

We are a victim of our success such that the demand for Bobath's service is growing quicker than its current funding initiatives and so our capacity to treat more children is constrained.

Consequently, since the year end, we have welcomed two new trustees, Caroline Cooksley and Marie Wood, both with expertise in marketing and fundraising whilst we have recruited a new Head of Income Generation, Rachel Morgan, following the retirement of Gail Griffiths.

We look forward to working with this new expanded team to grow our income, vital to fulfilling the charity's ambitions.

The coming year will present both strategic and financial challenges as we continue to strive towards the provision of specialist therapy for all children in Wales with cerebral palsy. Our strategy is continually under review and your Board and Management have agreed to continue to focus on our baby service and increase the Centre's capacity to treat and see more children on its waiting list.

It remains for me to thank all of our loyal and dedicated staff, our volunteers, supporters and my fellow Trustees for their continued support and good work, and in particular Gail Griffiths for fourteen years of phenomenal service.

Therapy



2016-2017 has been an exciting year. The challenge of having more families wanting to come for therapy makes us constantly review our service models and priorities. We have delivered 449 episodes of therapy as described below.

- 84 four-week blocks
- 81 baby and toddler blocks (one week)
- 2 complex returner blocks (one week)
- 73 review consults for returning children
- 40 initial consults and follow up visits for newly diagnosed children
- 39 single consults for older children

- 98 children treated at various types of outreach service in local communities
- 32 children treated as part of training courses

We are constantly striving to improve the service we provide to children, families and our community based therapy colleagues. This is the driver for us all and what keeps the whole team motivated. As part of this we evaluate our interventions and collect information from families and colleagues about what we could do better. We are aiming to involve families more in our service development and planning and continue to share our work widely. This year we have presented a number of studies at conferences, including:

- The Key to Empowering Families
- Parent led review – do therapists do what families ask them to do?
- “Together for Health” Service reorganisation for family centredness
- Goal setting priorities in children with cerebral palsy – are we addressing upper limb function?
- An exploratory study of the effect of Bobath therapy on the empowerment of caregivers attending Bobath Children's Therapy Centre Wales
- Trend analysis over seven years to demonstrate effectiveness of intervention

At Bobath Children's Therapy Centre Wales we see ourselves as part of a wider team supporting children in Wales who have cerebral palsy. To do



this effectively we need to support families and local teams delivering care. To achieve this we plan a step change in what the centre does and to expand our remit and services to become a Cerebral Palsy Centre for Wales. This would include an information hub and website for people who have cerebral palsy and their families, so that they can access useful information and signposting to services and opportunities. We also want to provide more therapy and participation opportunities for people who have cerebral palsy of all ages and levels of function. This will require new and more appropriate premises. As Bobath Wales approaches its 25th year we see the need to develop, change and adapt for the next 25 years ahead.

I would like to thank our staff, trustees and wonderful volunteers for all their hard work. Without each and every one of you Bobath Wales would not be the amazing place it is today. As a relatively small charity, I believe we punch well above our weight, and this is due entirely to the efforts of the whole team.

Fundraising

Our four shops in Llanishen, Rhiwbina and Crwys Road, Cardiff and Holton Road, Barry continue to be a major funding stream for us and we are incredibly fortunate to have an amazing band of volunteers to assist the shop managers. This year the shops made a profit of £95,000 and this is only made possible thanks to the thousands of people who donate their pre-loved goods for us to sell.

Families who attend the Centre also helped to raise an amazing £66,000, an unprecedented amount in recent years. Amongst these were Glyn Williams whose niece Rosie attends the Centre. Along with friends and colleagues Glyn organised a Coast to Coast Cycle Ride (400 miles from Fishguard, West Wales to Broadstairs, Kent) raising over £8,500. Dad, Daniel Kuck organised a Golf Day raising £2,800; Ben Bostock, who received therapy as a child and his friend Tom Clark organised Sea Beyond Disability, an event that saw both kayaking around the coast of Wales raising £1,437.

Our remarkable supporters continue to amaze us with their fundraising and I would like to highlight those people who have been supporting us over many years. Vera and Peter Makin who hold an annual garden party; Nyomi Lenny who organises the yearly Fashion v Beauty pageant; Friends of Plasterton Gardens, Cardiff who hold a Christmas Market every December which benefits Bobath Wales; South Wales Classic Car Club who make



a donation every May from their annual Classic Car Show; Sue Jones (Cwmcrafters Friends of Bobath) who raises money and helps organise the Aberdare Welly Walk each year; Derek Redwood and Mike Slater (Friends of Bobath Wales) who organise numerous events throughout the year which in 2017 included An Evening with Max Boyce.

How can we not mention our own Centre Director Jenny Carroll who started a year-long fundraising challenge of completing 1,580 miles. Jenny pledged to run 1 mile for every child with cerebral palsy in Wales = 1,260. Swim 1 mile for every baby born with cerebral palsy during 2016 = 70 miles. Cycle 10 miles for every year Bobath has been open in 2017 = 250 miles. Jenny hopes to complete the challenge in the summer of 2017. We are exceedingly grateful to Circle IT who continue to provide our IT support free of charge. Other corporate supporters who have boosted our cashflow include Harding Evans, Pembroke Dock Power Station, Eversheds Sutherland, Coffee#1, Ford Engine Plant Bridgend, Barclays Bank, Sweet Café & Bakery Whitchurch, Old Post House St Fagans, The BMJ and KK Solutions.

Trusts and Foundations are another vital income stream and we are extremely grateful to all those who awarded us grants this year, totalling £219,000. These included the Hodge Foundation who has supported the charity since its inception, this year donating an exceedingly generous £100,000 towards our Better Start, Better Future

programme with a commitment of a further £100,000 in 2017 and Henry Smith who awarded £20,500 towards a therapist salary.

Many events were held throughout the year including Bake for Bobath, A Question of Women, Golf Day, Birthday Ball, Dragon Boat Race, Welly Walks in Aberdare, Cardiff, Cwmbran and Caldicot, Autumn Afternoon Tea, Race Night, Jingle Bell Rock Party Night and a Carol Concert. New for this year was a sell-out event to celebrate St David's Day and our thanks go to Welsh Football Manager Chris Coleman and the FAW for helping to make 'An Evening with Chris Coleman' such a spectacular event.

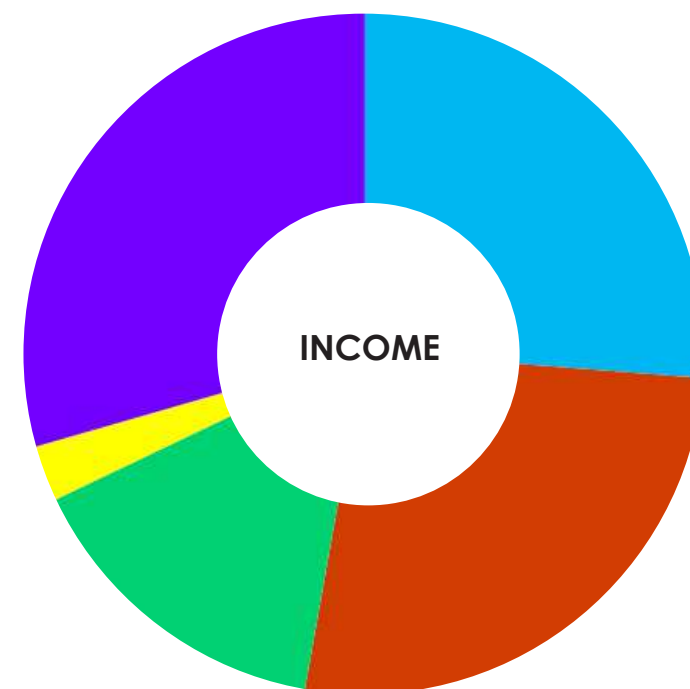

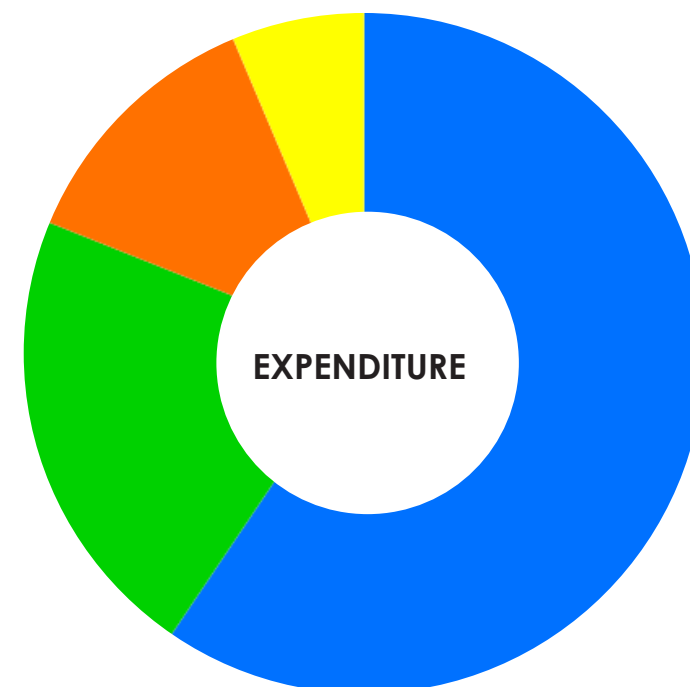

Better Start, Better Future

This year has seen us firmly embed our early intervention service within the Centre. The Better Start, Better Future programme has been developed with essential co-ordination and input from Glenys Evans, Family Support worker, who is the first point of contact for parents who have been counselled that their newly born baby may have high risk of or has been newly diagnosed with cerebral palsy.

Research tells us that the earlier we intervene in promoting development, the better. Increasing neuroscientific evidence shows that brain development and both fine and gross motor development continue after birth and are driven by activity. Early active movement and intervention are vital because infants who do not actively use the areas in the brain responsible for co-ordinating movement and posture risk losing critical connections and dedicated functions. Infant motor behaviour, through interaction with the environment, results in growth of muscles and bone as well as driving the ongoing development of the neuromotor system. By harnessing inherent neuroplastic

mechanisms in the brain, the early intervention we provide aims to optimise motor, cognitive and communication outcomes, prevent secondary impairments and minimise associated difficulties that may worsen function or interfere with learning. We also aim to promote parent understanding and infant bonding in order to minimise parental stress and anxiety.

Thanks to a major gift from the Hodge Foundation and generous donations from other trusts and foundations we have been able to provide vital early intervention support to families with vulnerable infants, free at the point of access and with minimal wait. This input takes the form of an initial consultation and/or 5 sessions of intensive therapy over 2 weeks every 3-4 months up to the age of 2.5 years, in close consultation with our NHS therapy colleagues. Over the past year (June 2016 to June 2017) we have provided 24 single consultations to infants new to our service and 77 intensive blocks of therapy. Questionnaire feedback from parents and families has been hugely positive and we are delighted



that 95% of therapy goals set for each block of input have resulted in positive change for the children. There have been significant challenges for our appointments team in co-ordinating a service that is responsive and flexible to the many and varied medical, work and child care issues faced by families with fragile young infants. We have addressed this through offering initial consultations which allows us to see families promptly, to provide early information and support and, importantly, to plan the forthcoming block of therapy to best meet each infant's and families' needs. Close liaison and communication with medical and therapy teams is essential to ensure accurate and up to date medical and therapy information, which can only be done with the support of our administrative team.

Meeting demand for the service continues, with 32 initial single consultations and around 100 blocks of therapy planned over the next year. The therapy team have risen to the challenge of providing support and relevant, effective packages of care for families, continuing to develop their expertise for infants with an evolving picture of cerebral palsy. We held a very successful 2 day course evaluating the Infant Motor Performance test. This was jointly attended by the Centre therapists and local NHS therapists interested in the field. We hope to host a week long specialist early intervention course in the near future for more junior members of the therapy team and interested NHS colleagues.

Datganiad y Cadeirydd

Mae'n bleser gennyf gyflwyno'r Adolygiad Blyneddol a'r Adroddiad ar Effaith ar gyfer 2016-17.

Eleni, rydym wedi wnebu nifer o heriau ariannol wrth i ni geisio tyfu ein capasiti ac ymateb i'r galw sy'n cynyddu o hyd am ddarpariaeth therapï arbenigol. Mae'r Bwrdd wedi blaenoriaethu Dechrau Gwell, Dyfodol Gwell, set y rhaglen Ymyrryd yn Gyfnar newydd ar gyfer babanod, penderfyniad a gafodd ei ategu gan dystiolaeth ymchwil. Yn ogystal â hyn, gwnaethom ymdrech i gynnal gwasanaeth cynhwstfawr i blant hyn, ond mae niferoedd y plant iau rydym yn eu gweld wedi effeithio ar hyn. Mae ein rhestr aros yn parhau i dyfu, gan roi galw cyson ar ein tîm codi arian i sicrhau cyllid er mwyn recriwio therapïddion ychwanegol fel y gallwn ddarparu therapï i fwy o blant ledled Cymru.



Mae'n bleser gennyf nodi ein bod wedi gallu cynnig 449 o ymyriadau triniaeth therapï yn ystod y flwyddyn. Roedd y rhain yn amrywio o ymgynghoriadau sengl i flociau hirach a mwy dwys, gyda babanod yn dychwelyd i gael therapï bob pedwar mis. Mae hwn yn gynnydd o 117 o gyfnodau gofal o gymharu â'r flwyddyn flaenorol, pan wnaethom ddarparu 332 o ymyriadau, ac mae'n adlewyrchu effaith y therapïddion newydd sydd wedi ymuno â'r tîm (gweler adroddiad Cyfarwyddwr y Ganolfan i gael rhagor o fanylion) yn ogystal â datblygiad modelau gwasanaeth newydd.

Rydym wedi wnebu rhai anawsterau ariannol. Mae canlyniadau eleni yn dangos incwm o £1,232,075 a gwarant o £1,283,124 gan arwain at ddiffyg arian parod o £51,049 a diffyg cyffredinol o £92,113 ar ôl costau dibrisiant o £41,064. Er ein bod yn parhau i gontractio Byrddau Iechyd Lleol ar gyfer atgyfeiriadau ar gyfer nifer o blant, mae'n rhaid i'r mwyafrif helaeth o'r incwm sydd ei angen i gynnal y Ganolfan gael ei godi drwy fentrau codi arian. Mae'r amgylchedd economaidd yn newid yn gyson ac mae'r tîm yn gweithio'n galed i addasu a chanolbwyntio ei ymdrechion a'i ffocws er mwyn ymateb i'r dirwedd newidiol hon.
